

Inside The Music

"I only recently heard Sinéad O'Connor's "Thank You For Hearing Me." I immediately thought that it reflected the goals and spirit of our community. As Pentecost is the day that we celebrate the birth of spiritual community, it seemed a natural fit. The simplicity of her formal choice gives the song immediacy. It's basically a chorus that repeats itself with one word changed each time. The gratitude that opens each new chorus pulls you in more closely with each repetition. The different ideas that flow from gratitude seem to deepen connection as they flow from a perhaps forgotten place that feels like home. As a progressive Christian community, we are careful when considering how to convey our message. Yet, at the heart of whoever we are is love, gratitude, and compassion. We are adding various language to the song to represent all of the languages spoken during the first Pentecost, and as a way of demonstrating that we are strong in our diversity. Saro-Lynch Thomason is a folk artist from North Carolina. Our friend Saunder wrote this inspired choral arrangement of her "More Waters Rising." It is a justice piece, encouraging us to keep moving. As we persist, we recognize that challenges are the substance of our successes. The divinity within us continues to recreate us as we strive toward a just and equitable society." ~ Dr. David Harris

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
